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Scope of the Conference

The conference will bring together road safety stakeholders to highlight RADAR's results and demonstrate the benefits of systematic approach to safer road infrastructure. It will contribute to the debate of prioritisation of road safety investments and network wide road safety assessments under revised RISM directive and broader. In addition, the conference will underline the need to work towards the implementation of both the United Nations and European Commission goals on road safety.

Objectives of the Conference:

 RADAR and Road Infrastructure Safety Management (Directive 2019/1936 amending the RISM Directive 2008/96)

RADAR will highlight the need to implement and develop a road infrastructure safety management system as part of the comprehensive efforts to improve road safety. With this objective RADAR supports the road authorities on the network-wide road safety assessment requirements of the new Directive 2019/1936

Danube Infrastructure Road Safety
 Improvement Strategy and National Action Plans

RADAR will present the first region-wide Danube Infrastructure Road Safety Improvement Strategy and National Action Plans defining clear steps for implementation of RADAR projects solutions whilst supporting the Second UN Decade of Action for Road Safety.

Infrastructure Safety Funding in post-Covid times

With the cooperation of EUSDR, the final conference will emphasise the need to keep road safety high in political agenda. It will focus on the immediate actions on awareness-raising as well as on the exchange of post-academic experiences which will influence the likelihood of less severe consequences of COVID-19 on road safety in Danube area in long run.
